

INFORMATION ON THE PROCESSING OF PERSONAL DATA

during the by-elections to the GMU Student Parliament

The Controller of your personal data is Gdynia Maritime University (81–87 Morska Street). The Controller has appointed a Data Protection Officer (e-mail: iod@umg.edu.pl).

Your personal data is processed on the basis of Article 6(1)(c) and (e) of Regulation (EU) 2016/679 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 27 April 2016 (GDPR), i.e., where processing is necessary for compliance with a legal obligation and for the performance of a task carried out in the public interest, in connection with the organisation and conduct of the by-elections to the Student Parliament of Gdynia Maritime University, in particular for the purposes of: registering candidates, verifying voting rights, conducting the vote, determining and announcing the election results, and archiving the election documentation.

Access to your personal data will be granted only to authorised employees of Gdynia Maritime University and members of the election committees appointed to conduct the elections. Recipients of the data may also include entities authorised to obtain them under applicable law.

Your personal data will not be transferred to third countries or international organisations.

Your personal data will not be subject to automated decision-making, including profiling.

The personal data processed are ordinary personal data.

The provision of personal data is voluntary; however, it is necessary in order to participate in the by-elections to the GMU Student Parliament. If you do not provide your personal data, you will not be able to take part in the elections. The election results may be made public to the extent provided for by applicable law and the University's internal regulations, in particular through the publication of the list of persons elected.

Your personal data will be processed for the period necessary to conduct and settle the electoral process, and will subsequently be stored in accordance with the rules on the archiving of documentation in force at Gdynia Maritime University.

You have the right to access your personal data and to have them rectified. To the extent provided for by law, you also have the right to erasure, restriction of processing, and to object to processing.

You have the right to lodge a complaint with the President of the Personal Data Protection Office in Warsaw if you consider that the processing of your personal data infringes the GDPR.
